THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading Revelation 11:19; 12:1-6, 10

A reading from the book of the Apocalypse *I saw a woman clothed with the sun and with the moon beneath her feet.*

The sanctuary of God in heaven opened, and the ark of the covenant could be seen inside it. Now a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman, adorned with the sun, standing on the moon, and with the twelve stars on her head for a crown. She was pregnant, and in labour, crying aloud in the pangs of childbirth. Then a second sign appeared in the sky, a huge red dragon which had seven heads and ten horns, and each of the seven heads crowned with a coronet. Its tail dragged a third of the stars from the sky and dropped them to the earth, and the dragon stopped in front of the woman as she was having the child, so that he could eat it as soon as it was born from its mother. Reflection on the Readings

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Presider: May we all be blessed with feelings of a mother's pure love, grace and strength today, and every day.

Reflection:

God intends to save all of creation. In Mary, we see our Christian destiny - a destiny given to us by God who, through Jesus, presents us with new life. Jesus is the hope of the life to come and our life in God. Mary embodies that same hope.

Today we celebrate the Assumption of Mary, body and soul into heaven. At the centre of all of it is Jesus, so to make sense of Mary's Assumption, we must understand Jesus' resurrection.

Jesus' resurrected body is a sure sign of hope for all people that we, too, might one day share in the same reality. St Paul's letter to the Corinthians says that Jesus was the first-fruits of all who had fallen asleep. These were the people who slumbered through Adam's sin but were then witnesses to Jesus' presence. Jesus was the first to bridge the gap between death and new life, and in his Ascension, we see Jesus ascending into heaven body and soul. Our hope is realised in Mary, who was Assumed into heaven body and soul. One day, in God's seasonal time, more people will experience the same.

The first fruits were the first few portions of a harvest dedicated to God. This was a sign that all things stemmed from God, especially the fruits of the earth and the fruits of human labour. It was also a pledge of hope that the next harvest would again come in God's seasonal time with greater volume. When reading the scriptures, you won't find many foundations for the Assumption of Mary as you would other beliefs. Yet the Assumption is founded upon many statements of faith, especially the Immaculate Conception (Mary born without sin). Maximillian Kolbe was attributed with saying, 'Never be afraid of loving the Blessed Virgin too much. You can never love her more than Jesus did." The Assumption too can be seen as a profound act of love for Mary, the Mother of God.

With such a gift prepared for us, we too join in Mary's song of praise. It's a song for those who feel just like everyone else. It's a song for those who feel that God has done amazing things in their lives. It's a song for those who have hungered to be a new person or to be a better version of themselves. Ultimately, Mary's song of praise is a song for you and me – pitched at a tone that we can sing and with notes that resonate beyond what we hear down to what we experience.

Although it's Mary that we celebrate today, let us take some time to recognise God's efforts towards us. Breaking the barrier of death was no small feat. Death no longer has the final say. The Word continues into God's embrace. Let's hold in prayer those of our loved ones who now sing with Mary and the saints, that we too might enjoy God's hymn of praise when our time arrives.
